The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, April 15, 2024, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Tony Hardisty, Scott Akin, Chris Standley, Bobbi Maynes, and Leland Shipley. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Akin at 9:00 AM. Maynes moved, seconded by Standley, to approve the agenda and the minutes of April 8 meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Secondary Roads Update: The ditch crew is out by Mt. Etna and moving to Prescott. Estimates are being gathered for new signs. Mack dump truck is back in service. The water pump has been replaced in the excavator. Working on getting the agreement aligned with Calhoun Burns to test our bridges. Will attempt some base stabilization next week on Juniper. The deck for Douglas 11 will be poured next week weather pending. The railroad contacted Dale and a payment should be coming soon for the Nodaway railroad crossing. Finished contract rock in central area of county and moving to northwest area.

Shipley moved, seconded by Standley, to approve Liquor License LC0047011 for The Vault. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Maynes moved, seconded by Shipley, to approve the 28E Agreement with the City of Corning and Adams County for the Jasper 1 Bridge. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Department Head Reports: Conservation – Hunter Education Class is complete, there were 16 students. Doing some controlled burns around the park. All water is on, and restrooms are open at the park. Some docks are in but some are still out due to low water levels. Marina will be open this weekend and only on weekends for a little bit longer. Working on the prairie grass project. On Earth Day, the FFA is doing a tree planting project supported by POET with 12-15 6-10' tall trees. A group of Griswold students came and picked up sticks and trash. Cabin and camp hosts are moved in. Have started mowing some high visible areas. Last weekend of the month the kayak launch will be installed. Still working on air release valves on sewer system. Auditor – Ballots are in and getting ready for testing, processing UOCAVA voters and other work as needed for preparations for Primary on June 4. IT – Panic buttons are in and being tested automatically each hour.
