

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, July 3, 2012, with the following members answering roll call: Linda England, Karl McCarty, Jerry Peckham and Doug Birt. Supervisor Mullen was absent. The meeting was called to order by the Chair. The agenda for the day was read and approved.

Having heard evidence from the Adams County Emergency Response Association, their attorney Rod Maharry, County Attorney Duane Golden, and County Treasurer Nancy Kempton, the Supervisors discussed the association's request for a transfer of title to them for a trailer purchased in 2004 using federal funds. Peckham moved, seconded by McCarty, to approve the release and transfer of title when it is presented to the B.O.S. and stipulate that Adams County license plates be removed from the trailer and returned to Adams County. Ayes: Birt, Peckham, McCarty, England. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Following a review of documents and pursuant to previous action, Chair England signed the proposal with Rasmussen Mechanical for work on the boiler. No votes were taken.

Birt moved, seconded by Peckham, to appoint Kelly Herring to fill a vacancy on ACCS. Ayes: Peckham, McCarty, England, Birt. Nays: none. Motion carried. No action was taken regarding filling a vacancy on the Board of Health.

Peckham moved, seconded by Birt to approve the mental health amendment to the Community & Family Resources, Ft. Dodge, Detox Agreement. Ayes: Peckham, McCarty, England, Birt. Nays: none. Motion carried.

A written quarterly report from the Adams County Auditor was read and approved.

Written reports by the Supervisors were submitted as follows: Karl McCarty – Heartland Alliance Management on June 28 at 6:00 PM; Linda England – Adams Taylor Landfill on June 27 at 7:30 PM.

The meeting was adjourned by the Board Chairman.
