

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, April 1, 2014, with the following members present: Linda England; Phyllis Mullen; Merlin Dixon; Karl McCarty; and Doug Birt. The meeting was called to order by the Chair. The agenda for the day was read and approved.

Mullen moved, seconded by England, to approve the purchase of a new motor grader. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Mullen moved, seconded by England, to approve permit number 14-02 for the SIRWA transmission tower. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Merlin Dixon presented Years of Service Awards to Eldon Rike, County Engineer, for his 35 years of service and to Phyllis Mullen, District 4 Supervisor, for her 15 years of service.

A department head meeting was held. Each department gave brief updates on the new things going on in their departments.

Mark Cory with Ahlers & Cooney joined via conference call to discuss the bonding process.

Birt moved, seconded by McCarty, to approve the tax abatement applications for County Urban Revitalization for the following people: Douglas Oldenkamp, Betty Jean Smith, Judy Loonan, Scott Akin, Nathan Grau, Steve Kralik, Jim Curtis, Cole Inman, and Joyce Green. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

McCarty moved, seconded by Birt, to approve the Fire Guard quote for Country Haven. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

England moved, seconded by Birt to appoint Andrew Zimmerman as the part-time County Attorney with a salary of \$45,000. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Donnie Ashenfelter and Darwin Shires held a discussion with the board regarding how their overtime is calculated. The board would like to have the union rep for secondary roads come clarify the union contract. No action was taken.
