There was a public hearing conducted for Chuck Welder's Incentive Zoning Application to request changing the zoning at 2030 Kale Ave, Corning from an A-1 Agricultural District to an Incentive I-1 Industrial District. Henry Heaton and Chuck Welder were present. Eldon reported that Marvin Jorgensen, adjoining land owner, had called to question what the notice was about. It was explained to him and he was satisfied. No other comments or objections were received. Motion was passed to change the zoning for said location from A1 Agricultural to I-1 Incentive Industrial.

Birt moved, seconded by England, to approve Incentive Zoning for said location from A1 Agricultural to I-1 Incentive Industrial. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Phyllis Mullen joined the meeting.

Eldon Rike discussed the railroad overpass project on 260th St. No action was taken.
