

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 am on Tuesday, August 18, 2015, with the following members present: Linda England, Leland Shipley, Merlin Dixon, and Karl McCarty. Doug Birt was absent. The meeting was called to order by the Chair, McCarty. The agenda for the day was read and approved.

England moved, seconded by Shipley to approve Access Systems to add a SEN license to the phone system so County Attorney Doug Daggett can tie all of his offices together with one phone system. All of the costs are covered by Doug Daggett's private practice. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

A brake ordinance for Hwy 34 and 148 was discussed with Stan Grebner, Eldon Rike, and Alan Johannes. The concerns with the truck traffic at the Loomis Corner on Hwy 34 due to the increased truck traffic from the wind turbines were brought up to Signal Energy and the board was informed they would discuss this issue with their drivers. They were also told that within a month or two the majority of the semi traffic in that area would decline drastically. The board discussed waiting until then to see if the issue is still present after this time. No action was taken.

Discussion on ordinances with Andrew Zimmerman was tabled.
