

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 am on Tuesday, April 5, 2016, with the following members present: Karl McCarty, Doug Birt, Linda England, Leland Shipley, and Merlin Dixon. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson England. The agenda for the day was read and approved.

Dixon moved, seconded by Birt to approve the Recorder's Quarterly Report presented by Recorder Stargell. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Recorder Stargell discussed with the board her desire to destroy expired Uniformed Commercial Codes (UCC) that are not required to be retained. Recorder Stargell requested approval of the board to purge the UCC's. Birt moved, seconded by Dixon to approve the disposal of expired UCC's at the request of the Recorder. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Birt moved, seconded by Shipley to approve the Secondary Road's proposed budget amendment. Engineer Rike explained that their department had received some additional funding to fix a bridge and also had another bridge to repair. Engineer Rike asked to increase his expenditures by \$200,000. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

County Attorney Daggett and his secretary, Lisa Brown, approached the board about collecting court fees and fines. Currently, fines and fee revenue are going to the State of Iowa and that Adams County is missing out on 40% of that revenue. Taylor, Ringgold, Decatur, and Fremont counties currently are collecting fines and fees for their counties and have extended an offer to Adams County to join their 28E agreement to be able to do the same. The revenue from the collection of fines and fees would go back into the county's General Fund to help recoup costs. The board asked Daggett to bring a 28E Agreement before them to review.

Joan Gallagher with Taylor County Public Health discussed with the board the desire of Adams County Board of Health to contract with Taylor County Board of Health to provide services for Adams County that are currently being contracted with CHS through CHI. CHS no longer wants to facilitate Adams County's Public Health and Home Health Care.

Oral committee reports by the supervisors were given as follows: Birt – Crossroads in Creston at 6:00 pm on March 28, Quad Counties 4 kids in Creston at 6:00 pm, and DCAT in Creston at 10:00 am March 31; and England – SICOG Annual Meeting in Creston at 1:00 pm on March 31.
