

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, October 23, 2017, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Merlin Dixon, Linda England, Doug Birt, Karl McCarty, and Leland Shipley. Also in attendance were Stan Grebner, Travis Paul, Andy Knuth, Arnold Maynes, Stacey Maynes, Doug Oldenkamp, Eldon Rike, Alan Johannes, and Mark Saylor. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Shipley. The agenda for the day was read and approved.

Eldon Rike discussed with the board what it would take to move Iris Lane back to the center line. He said there will be a lot of dirt moved and the ditch would impede on Oldenkamp's property and retaining wall. Arnold Maynes was concerned with that area drifting snow and not being able to get through to his drive way if they moved the road. The board reviewed Adams County's GIS aerial of the road from 2015 and determined the road went past Oldenkamp's driveway and was already off the center line. The board said they were going to leave the road where it is currently.

Birt moved, seconded by England to approve the recommendations from the County Sanitarian Carl Goodson to dig out the old septic tank and old large cistern that are on the county farm property to properly remedy the structures. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Dixon moved, seconded by Birt to appoint Leland Shipley to the Adams Community Foundation Board of Directors for a three year term ending December 31, 2020. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

McCarty moved, seconded by Birt to approve offering first aid and CPR Training for employees on an annual basis and will reimburse the cost only when the employee's certification is ready to expire. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding medical charges for inmates. Adams County has been receiving bills for medical expenses anytime an inmate needs treatment. Sheriff Johannes is concerned about how this is going to affect his budget. Auditor Bissell is working with Lisa Wolf from CHI to see if the county can receive a negotiated rate similar to what insurance companies receive. Attorney Knuth offered that we need to keep our options open and possibly start taking inmates to the lowest cost facility.

Travis Paul updated the board on what projects are going on at Lake Icaria including the sewer bids for the cottages.
