

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, October 21, 2019 at 9:00 am with the following members present: Merlin Dixon, Leland Shipley, Doug Birt, Scott Akin and Bobbi Maynes. Also in attendance were: Nancy Barnes, Jamie Stargell, and Travis Malone. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Shipley. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Birt to approve today's agenda and the minutes from October 14, 2019. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Joan Gallagher presented the Public Health Annual Report for FY19 and updated the board on her replacement and the other new hire.

Engineer Travis Malone updated the board of supervisors regarding the Hull Street. Bridge project and has put forward a draft 28E agreement between the county and city of Corning. Possible additional funding sources for a trail on Hull Street. have also been identified. Malone expects to have a contract with JEO for Juniper Ave ready for approval at next week's meeting. Secondary Roads has taken possession of its new equipment trailer and the old one is at Kretzinger's Auction ready to sell. Approximately two-thirds (or 67 miles) of the county's pavement have been striped by county forces in past several weeks.

Akin moved, seconded by Maynes to approve the draft HIPAA manual. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.
