Increase in fuel expenses and facilitated a grant for the County Attorney's department, ARPA funds and other unforeseen administrative costs. Voting Aye: Birt, Shipley, Dixon, Maynes, Akin. The board reviewed Adams County Ordinances Chapters 1-5.

Discussion on Courthouse renovations took place. Surveyors and hazardous material inspectors have been to the courthouse.

Department Head Reports – IT – Tom Williams has been evaluating software to help him monitor the courthouse's IT operations and he is working on which software to implement. Treasurer – Holly Schafer stated the County Tax Sale is set for June 20th. The delinquent list will be published in next week's paper. Sheriff's Dept – Sheriff Johannes stated the Sheriff's office received notice that Primrose will no longer be providing meals for the jail. Johannes is currently looking for other options. He also informed the board the rear end went out on one of the sheriff's trucks and will need to be fixed. Recorder – Jamie Stargell reported that her Deputy is looking to retire next fiscal year so there will be a need for a budget amendment. Secondary Roads – Karl informed the board that replacement costs on equipment is going up and he is working on providing new numbers to our insurance provider which will increase our premium. Conservation – Travis Paul shared he's working on grants for future projects. The department purchased another mower and ATV. He and his staff have been participating in educational programs with multiple grades from several schools these past few weeks.

Committee and Meeting reports were presented as follows: Maynes – Crossroads Finance via Zoom, May 17, RC&D, April 17, Creston; Birt – SICOG, May 20, Greenfield; and Akin – ACEDC, May 19, Corning, and Southern Hills Mental Health, May 20, Corning.

Akin moved, seconded by Dixon to adjourn at 10:45 am. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.
