Minutes

The meeting was called to order with Commissioners Jon Brokaw, Jim Reynolds, Nancy Carmichael, Sandra Leininger and Marti Gebbie present. Linda Newsome was also in attendance. Reynolds moved and Brokaw seconded approval of the agenda. All Ayes. Reynolds moved and Brokaw seconded approval of the October minutes. All Ayes. It was noted that the Treasurer's balance was the same as the previous month.

Commissioners again shared some of their research successes and frustrations regarding the Old Quincy Cemetery, Queen City Cemetery, Rockdale Cemetery, Mt Pleasant Cemetery, and the Slide Off (Old Settler's Cemetery). Several accolades were given to the Recorder & Assessor offices for their assistance with land records, death records, and mapping. The commissioners settled on a plan of action in dealing with problem cemeteries. Work on the GPR survey effort was also discussed with those in attendance suggesting that "clean up" from their previous work should be completed prior to beginning survey work at Mt Pleasant and Old Quincy. Sandra shared a message from Cris Allen regarding their inability to complete any work on the Mauderley burial site this fall due to weather.

Sandra announced that Tuesday's are the best meeting day for Commissioners. She will work on the Wayside Inn Signage verbiage.

Commissioners were encouraged to review the 2021 Workplan and Budget. Both will be taken up at the December 13th meeting.

Nancy reported that the streetscape public forum will be held on November 16th and that the City of Corning may ask for assistance with historic preservation grants for the Widener Bldg at 729 Davis.
