WHEREAS, a proposed Amendment No. 1 to the Plan ("Amendment No. 1" or "Amendment") for the Urban Renewal Area described above has been prepared, which proposed Amendment has been on file in the office of the County Auditor and which is incorporated herein by reference, the purpose of which is to update the description of previously approved urban renewal projects and to identify new urban renewal projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment covered by the Plan, as amended; and

WHEREAS, this proposed Amendment No. 1 adds no new land to the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on May 8, 2023, this Board directed that a consultation be held with the designated representatives of all affected taxing entities to discuss the proposed Amendment No. 1 and the division of revenue described therein, and that notice of the consultation and a copy of the proposed Amendment No. 1 be sent to all affected taxing entities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such notice, the consultation was duly held as ordered by the Board of Supervisors and all required responses to the recommendations made by the affected taxing entities, if any, have been timely made as set forth in the report of the Becky Bissell, County Auditor, or her delegate, filed herewith and incorporated herein by this reference, which report is in all respects approved; and

WHEREAS, by resolution this Board also set a public hearing on the adoption of the proposed Amendment No. 1 for this meeting of the Board, and due and proper notice of the public hearing was given, as

provided by law, by timely publication in the Adams County Free Press, which notice set forth the time and place for this hearing and the nature and purpose thereof; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the notice, all persons or organizations desiring to be heard on the proposed Amendment No. 1, both for and against, have been given an opportunity to be heard with respect thereto and due consideration has been given to all comments and views expressed to this Board in connection therewith and the public hearing has been closed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ADAMS COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That the findings and conclusions set forth or contained in Amendment No. 1 concerning the area of Adams County, State of Iowa, described in the preamble hereof, be and the same are hereby ratified and confirmed in all respects as the findings of this Board for this area.

Section 2. This Board further finds:

- a) Although relocation is not expected, a feasible method exists for the relocation of any families who will be displaced from the Urban Renewal Area into decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations within their means and without undue hardship to such families;
- b) The Plan, as amended, and Amendment No. 1 conform to the general plan for the development of the County as a whole; and
- c) Acquisition by the County is not immediately expected, however, as to any areas of open land to be acquired by the County included within the Urban Renewal Area:
 - i. Residential use is not expected, however, with reference to any portions thereof which are to be developed for residential uses, this Board of Supervisors hereby determines that a shortage of housing of sound standards and design with decency, safety and sanitation exists within the County; that the acquisition of the area for residential uses is an integral part of and essential to the program of the municipality; and that one or more of the following conditions exist:
 - a. That the need for housing accommodations has been or will be increased as a result of the clearance of slums in other areas, including other portions of the urban renewal area.
 - b. That conditions of blight in the municipality and the shortage of decent, safe and sanitary housing cause or contribute to an increase in and spread of disease and crime, so as to constitute a menace to the public health, safety, morals, or welfare.
 - c. That the provision of public improvements related to housing and residential development will encourage housing and residential development which is necessary to encourage the retention or relocation of industrial and commercial enterprises in this state and its municipalities.
 - d. The acquisition of the area is necessary to provide for the construction of housing for low and moderate income families.
 - ii. Non-residential use is expected and with reference to those portions thereof which are to be developed for non-residential uses, such non-residential uses are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.

Section 3. That the Urban Renewal Area, as amended, continues to be an economic development area within the meaning of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; that such area is eligible for designation as an urban renewal area and otherwise meets all requisites under the provisions of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or a combination thereof, of such area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of this County.

Section 4. That Amendment No. 1 to the Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan of Adams County, State of Iowa, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference, be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as "Amendment No. 1 to the Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan for Adams County, State of Iowa"; Amendment No. 1, including all of the exhibits attached thereto, is hereby in all respects approved; and the County Auditor is hereby directed to file a certified copy of Amendment No. 1 with the proceedings of this meeting.

Section 5. That, notwithstanding any resolution, ordinance, plan, amendment or any other document, Amendment No. 1 shall be in full force and effect from the date of this Resolution until the Board amends or repeals the Plan. The proposed Amendment No. 1 shall be forthwith certified by the County Auditor, along with a copy of this Resolution, to the Recorder for Adams County, Iowa, to be filed and recorded in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. That all other provisions of the Plan not affected or otherwise revised by the terms of Amendment No. 1, as well as all resolutions previously adopted by this Board of Supervisors related to the Plan be and the same are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved in all respects.

Amendment No. 1 to the Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan for the Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Area

Adams County, Iowa Original Area – 2022 Amendment No. 1 - 2023 INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

The Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan ("Plan" or "Urban Renewal Plan") for the Southern Hills Wind Farm Urban Renewal Area ("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), adopted in October 2022, is being amended by this Amendment No. 1 ("Amendment" or "Amendment No. 1") to update the description of previously approved urban renewal projects and to identify new urban renewal projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area.

No land is being added to or removed from the Urban Renewal Area by this Amendment. Accordingly, the previously established "base value" or "base valuation" of the Urban Renewal Area (if any) will remain unchanged by this Amendment.

Except as modified by this Amendment, the provisions of the original Urban Renewal Plan are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved and shall remain in full force and effect as provided herein. In case of any conflict or uncertainty, the terms of this Amendment shall control.

Any subsection of the Plan not mentioned in this Amendment shall continue to apply to the Plan.

AREA DESIGNATION

The Urban Renewal Area continues to be an economic development area that is appropriate for the promotion of economic development (including commercial and industrial development).

DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Adams County has a general plan for the physical development of the County as a whole, outlined in the <u>Comprehensive Plan - Corning and Adams County, IA</u>, adopted in 1966. The goals and objectives identified in this Plan, and the urban renewal projects described herein, are in conformance with the goals and land use policies identified in the <u>Comprehensive Plan - Corning and Adams County, IA</u>.

This Amendment does not in any way replace or modify the County's current land use planning or zoning regulation process.

The need for improved traffic, public transportation, public utilities, recreational and community facilities, or other public improvements within the Urban Renewal Area is set forth in this Amendment. As the Area develops, the need for public infrastructure extensions and upgrades will be evaluated and planned for by the County.

UPDATE TO PREVIOUSLY APPROVED URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS

The Urban Renewal Plan identified several urban renewal projects. Except as expressly noted below, those projects remain unaltered by this Amendment and are hereby confirmed. With the adoption of this Amendment No. l, the County is updating the description of the following urban renewal project that was originally approved in the Urban Renewal Plan.

1. Public Improvements:

A. Bridge ID - Prescott 13: In the Urban Renewal Plan, the County authorized roadway improvements for Bridge ID - Prescott 13 as an urban renewal project. The original Plan authorized \$882,600 for this project to be reimbursed through TIF. The expected costs of this project have increased. Accordingly, with the adoption of this Amendment, the County is authorizing an additional \$152,400 for this project's costs, for total project costs not to exceed \$1,035,000 to be reimburse through TIF.

ELIGIBLE URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS (Amendment No. 1)

In addition to previously authorized urban renewal projects, the County is identifying the following additional urban renewal project in this Amendment No. 1:

EFFECTIVE PERIOD

This Amendment No. 1 will become effective upon its adoption by the Board of Supervisors and will remain in effect until it is repealed by the Board of Supervisors. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Plan or any prior resolution or document, the Plan, as amended, shall remain in effect until terminated by the Board of Supervisors.

The use of incremental property tax revenues, or the "division of revenue," as those words are used in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, will be consistent with Chapter 403 of the Iowa Code. Nothing in this Amendment shall alter the duration of the division of revenue as previously explained in the Plan.

REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

Any parts of the previous Plan in conflict with this Amendment are hereby repealed. If any part of this Amendment or the Plan is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the Amendment or the Plan as a whole, or any part of the Amendment or the Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.

Almost done with the Northeast area with contract rock and will move to the Southwest area to complete contract rock soon. Prescott Wind Farm maps of wind turbine placement have been submitted. IT – Meeting with OCIO to go over Cloudstrike install. If there are no issues it will be installed on all the computers. There is a computer in dispatch that keeps acting up. Treasurer - \$76,000 left to collect and 132 parcels still left to pay property taxes. Recorder – Hired Bree Brandt to begin June 30th as the Deputy Recorder. Several great applicants had applied. Auditor – Working on verifying levy rates in preparation for compilation of taxes. Have an ICAP Board of Directors meeting this Wed -Thurs. Conservation – Sewer lift station is having issues but think they have it resolved. If it isn't it could be a big hit to the budget to have it repaired or replaced. Camping is going well. Working on buying more equipment for the lake with the grant money.
