## **Board Minutes August 7, 2023**

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, August 7, 2023, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Leland Shipley, Tony Hardisty, Chris Standley, and Scott Akin. Bobbi Maynes was absent. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Shipley and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve the agenda along with the minutes of July 31<sup>st</sup> regular meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

County Engineer Bechtold updated the board that Quincy 8 should be completed in about 8 weeks. Hull Street still has some punch list items to finish. There was a meeting last week concerning the Nodaway railroad crossing and there will be another this week with the parties involved. Met with John Thomas of Hungry Canyons about potential projects on Filbert, Fig, Juniper, and 195<sup>th</sup>. Met with Montgomery County on a potential coop project on old Highway 34.

Hardisty moved, Akin seconded to approve the purchase of a vehicle for the Sheriff's department for \$44,000. All supervisors approved. Motion carried.

Discussion and possible approval of hiring a firm to update the Adams County Comprehensive Plan was tabled until next week.

Jeanne Jackson presented to the board her list of concerns. Marvis Northup asked the board to place on the agenda a vote on a moratorium.

Department Head Reports: Treasurer – Schafer reported tax statements should be in the mail this week. Sheriff – Johannes reported that the department was assisting with the trial in the courthouse. They are at full staffing with the SRO to start next week. IT – CrowdStrike Phase 2 will be implemented. Will be working with the Sheriff's Department with their new body cameras. Recorder – Stargell stated everything was going well and nothing new to report. Auditor – Will be attending ISAC Summer School the end of the month and starting to work on the November City School election. Secondary Roads – Dave Levy has reached out. Will let him know that the decision on comprehensive plan will be tabled another week.
