The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Akin at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Maynes moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve the agenda and the minutes of August 19th meeting. Secondary Roads Update – Planer has been used with blowups on the highways. Surveyed Union 10 bridge to fix rough approaches. Getting started on Hungry Canyon project. Ordered metal culverts and will be getting to work on replacing culverts. Safety Action Plan meeting from 8:30-11:30 am on Friday. Still working with FEMA to get reimbursement and agreeing on starting and stopping points for the road and rock that was replaced after the tornado damage. Need to get a plan in place for the closed bridge on 198th Lane and then potentially close the road.

Shipley moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve signing a letter of support for the Widener building revitalization project to apply for a T-Mobile Grant. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Maynes moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve using ARPA funds to have Bill Lyddon build a privacy fence around the Sheriff's outdoor enclosure for inmates for \$3990. The fence will be made of composite material and will be 8 feet tall. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Department Head Reports – Treasurer – Tax Statements went out August 12th. We used a new vendor so the statement looks a little different. First half of property taxes are due by September 30th. Auditor – Met with Solutions Software staff at the conference last week. Shared concerns and was assured they will carve out some time to look into our problem. Presented last week on Safe & Secure Elections to a joint meeting between Supervisors and Auditors at the ISAC Conference. Conservation – Getting ready for the Labor Day holiday weekend coming up. Hosted the first Triathlon with 37 participants in the full race and several others in the 5k race. It went very smoothly and received lots of compliments with a few recommendations. Greatly appreciated all the volunteers that helped that day to make it a great event for our community. They did some gravel fill in along the running route and the high school will be utilizing it for their cross country meets. Sept 1st is the opening day for dove and teal season. Fall fishing should pick up after the heat wave. An employee resigned from the department. The state passed a law allowing legal ATV/UTV's on park roads which was enacted July 1. Due to the state owning the land of Lake Icaria and the Conservation Board managing it, this law permits them within the park but only on paved surfaces.

Kristina Paradise and Dave Sturm with Snyder & Associates gave a presentation on being able to provide professional services to Adams County as the designated County Inspection Services for the Carbon Pipeline construction. The cost of this would be paid by Summit Carbon Solutions and not with tax dollars.
