Crystal Drake with Adams/Taylor Public Health gave an update to the board. She provided home health program numbers. Wrapped up flu shot clinics and have two more businesses ask for clinics at their places of work. Tracking sewer samples to see what outbreaks there are in the community. Also tracking school absenteeism for outbreaks. There is a measles outbreak in Minnesota, so they are watching that to see if it spreads to Iowa since measles are highly contagious. Whooping cough is on the rise in Iowa. Working with Ambulance department carryover preparedness funds to provide EMS boxes in rural areas so that they might have a higher response time. Planning for three staff members retiring next year. Still partnering with MATURA, WIC programs, and MH region on other programs. Addressed the long-term State of Iowa plan to form Public Health regions set for July 1, 2027.
