

## Board Minutes January 26, 2026

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, January 26, 2026, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Scott Akin, Chris Standley, and Leland Shipley. Tony Hardisty and Bobbi Maynes were absent. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Standley at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to approve the agenda and the minutes of the January 20<sup>th</sup> meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried. Public comments were received.

Secondary Roads Update – Snow crew went out Saturday morning. The quarry was closed on Friday. Continuing to grind trees and haul rock. CPR training will be on February 4. Hearing test will be on February 9. Ordered 43 first aid kits. Calhoun and Burns will be giving an update to the engineering staff. Carter and Dale are working on prioritizing projects. Attended DOT local systems update. Hiring Murphy Construction to replace Prescott 24 as a rehab project. Setting up preconstruction with Dixon Construction for Lincoln 3 and 4.

County Attorney Knuth recommends amending the burial assistance portion of Ordinance Chapter 6, General Assistance. He will draft language and discuss the amendment process next week. Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to table action on Ordinance Chapter 6, General Assistance. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Budget presentations were received as follows: Public Health.

Department heads reports: Treasurer – Starting to receive elderly credit applications. The office is busy with titling and driver's licenses. IT – Last Thursday Microsoft was down and we couldn't receive emails. Conservation – Ice conditions are four to six inches on the lake. Will attend hearing test and CPR training with Secondary Roads. Reconstructing trails and clearing out some trees. New surfacing of Class A rock on the trail. Ordered native seed blend for pond dam and clearing areas. Installing erosion mats on steep areas while it is being established. Crossings made with tubes should hold water and have additional silt ponds/basins for the lake. Plan to place minnows and wood duck boxes. Eliminated three crossings and rerouted trail to stay closer to the lake. Met with the contractor that will work on beach retaining wall. Was awarded a Community Foundation grant. Sheriff – Busy as usual. Obtaining two quotes for new AC system. Attorney – Continue to have difficulty placing mental health committals. Auditor – In the pre-planning stages of the primary election. We have been very busy with passport appointments. Attended Super 6 district meeting.

Committee and Meeting Reports: Standley – Super 6, January 23, Osceola; Shipley – Super 6, January 23, Osceola, Main Street EV, January 21, Corning; Akin – ACEDC, January 19, Corning, Adams/Taylor Landfill, January 20, Corning; CHI, January 22, Corning.
