

## Board Minutes March 30, 2026

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, March 30, 2026, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Scott Akin, Leland Shipley, Bobbi Maynes, Chris Standley and Tony Hardisty. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Standley at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Maynes to approve the agenda and the minutes of the March 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried. Public comments were received.

Secondary Roads Update – Carter passed out copies of the 5-year plan and Dale is working a rock area map. Hauling rock continues to go well. RJ's Plumbing looked at sewer; there is a section of pipe going uphill causing backup issues.

### RESOLUTION FOR ROAD VACATION PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, a memorandum from the County Engineer has been filed with the Adams County Board of Supervisors asking that action be taken to vacate and close a section of Adams County Secondary Road, as described as follows:

That portion of "198th Lane", established April 1, 1884 (See Road Record Book 4, page 108), commencing at the SW corner of the NE corner of the SW corner of Section 20, T72N, R34W, thence running east 3/4 mile to the East line of Section 20, T72N, R34W, and including any remaining adjoining road in Section 21, T72N, R34W.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a Public Hearing on the proposed vacation will be held in the Board Room, Adams County Courthouse, Corning, Iowa, 50841, at 9:30 AM on Monday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2026, in accordance with Iowa Code Chapter 306.

Shipley moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve Resolution 2026-15 Set Public Hearing for road vacation of 198<sup>th</sup> Lane for April 13, 2026, at 9:30 am. Ayes: Shipley, Akin, Hardisty, Maynes, Standley. Nays: none. Motion carried. The full resolution is on file in the Auditor's office.

Maynes moved, seconded by Akin to approve Iowa DOT Agreement No: 4-25-HBP-S-004, federal bridge funding agreement for Prescott 10 Bridge Replacement. All supervisors vote aye. Motion carried.

Veterans Affairs does not plan to pursue a 28E agreement with Taylor County.

Shipley moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve County Tax Abatements. Ayes: Shipley, Hardisty, Standley. Nays: none. Abstained: Akin and Maynes. Motion carried.

Akin moved, seconded by Maynes to approve 3% for all hourly and salaried employees except for 2.5% for Attorney, and 9% for Sheriff for FY26/27. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on Ambulance Management Services Agreement with County Attorney Knuth.

Chair called for a recess at 10:00. Came back from recess at 10:10 am.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to set the public hearing for the FY26/27 Budget for April 20, 2026, at 10:00 am. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Department heads reports: Veterans Affairs – Preparing for Memorial Day. Will not plan to pursue a 28E agreement with Taylor County. Auditor – The office will be closed on Wednesday so we can attend SEAT Continuing Education. Absentee ballot requests can be received until May 18. Working on ICAP Insurance supplement application. Sheriff – Busy weekend. Conservation – Docks were installed last week and turning water on in the park. Several memorial benches have been donated. Concrete project going well. The wall at the beach is poured. Installing tile and back fill today. Poured parking lot wall. Plan to finish barrier and pour sidewalk this week. Excellent fish report. Water level is still about one foot low. Working on switching credit card providers. Hosted a program on critters with 90 in attendance. Cottages are mostly full for the season and have some cabin rentals available. Will be residing cabins 9-14.
