

## Board Minutes May 4, 2026

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, May 4, 2026, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Scott Akin, Leland Shipley, Bobbi Maynes, Chris Standley and Tony Hardisty. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Standley at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Maynes to approve the agenda and the minutes of the April 27<sup>th</sup> meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried. There were no public comments.

Secondary Roads Update – Hauling rock. Dirt crew is working on tree removals. Working on easements for upcoming projects. Signed consulting agreement with HGM for Carl 4 replacement. Dixon Construction is driving pile this week.

Maynes moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve Utility Permits 26-03 - SIRWA and 26-04 – SIRWA. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to set a public hearing for May 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:15 am for the FY 25/26 budget amendment. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on a moratorium for Data Centers.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to approve Adams County Safety Policy including pre-employment physicals and drug screenings for new hires and CPR and first aid training for all permanent employees. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Department heads reports: EMA – Completed ESF. HSEM grant for hazard mitigation was approved and submitted first quarter report. Have not received EMPG funding for 2025 yet; completed first quarter report for 2026. Have a hazard mitigation contract with SICOG. Working with local departments for crisis intervention. Maintenance – Drained the boiler and Jones Mechanical will dismantle it for internal inspection this week. Have sowed 50 pounds of grass. Turf Solutions will also look at the lawn. IT – Working on internet issues for Sheriff's new vehicle. The state is switching from ICN to a service that uses the internet for Sheriff and emergency departments. Plan to have an AI policy draft this week. Auditor – Continue election preparations. Certifying budgets. Working on budget amendment.

Committee and Meeting Reports: Maynes – HHS Behavioral Health, April 30, via Zoom; Shipley – Main Street, April 29, Corning, Loss Control, May 4, Corning; Hardisty – SCI911, April 30, Creston.

Akin moved, seconded by Hardisty to adjourn the meeting at 9:45 AM. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.
