

Board Minutes August 17, 2026

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, August 17, 2026, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Chris Standley, Leland Shipley, Scott Akin, Bobbi Maynes, and Tony Hardisty. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Standley at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Maynes to approve the agenda and the minutes of the August 10th meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried. There were no public comments.

Secondary Roads Update – Gus has been pouring the box culvert on Union 17. The Hungry Canyon project on 170th Street has started. The crew plans to replace the crossroad tube by the golf course today. The crew will brush shoulder rock off the road in preparation for the triathlon. Erman Corporation plans on having the Nodaway 8 tank cars processed by Tuesday and shipping is scheduled for later this week. Cater will be attending Adams County Historic Preservation Commission regarding Jasper 1 and Nodaway 9. Dale and Carter will be attending IMWCA Supervisors Training on August 26.

Hardisty moved, seconded by Maynes to approve Utility Permit 26-06 – Windstream Iowa Communications (Uniti). All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to approve contract for FM-CO02(84)—55-02, County Wide Pavement Marking Project. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Maynes moved, seconded by Shipley to approve Right-of-Way Contract for Carl 16 Bridge Project in the amounts of \$1,025.75 and \$2,509.75. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION FOR ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMITS Adams County Resolution No. 2026-40

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of the Iowa Code Sections 321.255 and 321.285 of the Code of Iowa, to determine upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, that the speed limit of any secondary road is greater than is reasonable and proper under the conditions existing, and may determine and declare a reasonable and proper speed limit, and

WHEREAS, such an investigation has been requested and has been completed by the Adams County Engineer.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ADAMS COUNTY that the speed limit be established and appropriate signs be erected at the location described as follows:

On 210th St. (County Road H34) from Corning City Limits to the Montgomery County Line - 45mph

Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to approve Resolution 2026-40 Speed establishment on 210th St. (County Road H34). Ayes: Maynes, Akin, Hardisty, Shipley, Standley. Nays: none. Motion carried. The original resolution is on file in the Auditor's Office.

RESOLUTION FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF STOP SIGN PLACEMENT Adams County Resolution No. 2026-41

WHEARAS, Adams County has the authority to place stop signs, and

WHEREAS, the intersection of Dogwood Avenue and 140th Street is a "T" intersection, with Dogwood Avenue coming from the north and 140th Street coming from the east being the thru route, and

WHEREAS, the only stop sign currently in place causes traffic on 140th Street coming from the east to stop, and

WHEREAS, a review of traffic counts produced by the Iowa Department of Transportation does not support the current signing scheme, and

WHEREAS, Adams County has a desire to make the intersection more in line with the current thru route,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by Adams County Board of Supervisors that the stop sign placed on 140th Street to cause traffic coming from the east to stop at the intersection of Dogwood Avenue and 140th Street shall be removed and a stop sign shall be placed on Dogwood Avenue to cause traffic coming from the south to stop at said intersection.

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Shiple moved, seconded by Hardisty to approve Resolution 2026-41Traffic control establishment for the intersection of Dogwood Ave. and 140th Street. Ayes: Maynes, Akin, Hardisty, Shipley, Standley. Nays: none. Motion carried. The original resolution is on file in the Auditor’s Office.

Raelynn Robison presented ACEDC mid-year report.

Department heads reports: Conservation – Preparing for the triathlon on August 22. A volunteer meeting will be August 21. Hunter Education will be September 18 and 19. Conservation Board is looking at adding sewer and water utilities to 14 more Lake View sites, and possible replacement of Tiber Ridge restroom. Auditor – Completed and mailed bonding document to the attorney. Completed portion of the tax process and sent information to Treasurer. Gathering information for various reports.
